Hereby extends sincere commendations to the
City of Fountain

The City of Fountain was informed by the EPA that its water supply tested positive for perfluorinated compounds (PFCs). The level exceeded the EPA's Health Advisory Level of 70 parts per trillion. The primary source of the PFCs is Peterson Air Force Base. The City of Fountain asked for and received co-operation from the Air Force to reduce PFC levels in the groundwater. A short-term solution now exists with the Air Force installing Granular Activated Carbon filters. For a long term solution, the City of Fountain is partnering with the Air Force to construct an ion exchange water treatment plant at Aga Park. The two treatment systems have shown the ability to remove PFCs to non-detectable levels. The Colorado House of Representatives acknowledges the City of Fountain and their on-going efforts to respond to the health and safety concerns of their community and to their recent resolution to establish a groundwater treatment standard of 2 parts per trillion.
